#### Report by Assistant Chief Executive (Operations)

##### 1. Object of report

To advise the Committee of the work of SPT that has been shortlisted for the Scottish Transport Awards 2016 (STAs) and to recommend approval for three members of the Partnership Board to attend the event that will be held at the Radisson Hotel, Glasgow on 16 June 2016.

##### 2. Background

The STAs is an annual event celebrating the best of the Scottish transport scene. As members will be aware, SPT has been recognised at the STAs for its hard work and efforts in improving transport in the West of Scotland with a number of awards over recent years, including the Transport Authority of the Year in 2014.

In addition to this, the event also provides significant opportunity for networking and learning of best practice in transport across the country.

##### 3. Outline of proposals

SPT, in being shortlisted for a number of awards over many years, has hosted a table at the STAs, and utilises that opportunity to recognise the work of SPT staff and partner organisations in nominated projects through inviting them to attend. In addition to the attendance of SPT senior officers, the table has been hosted by three Partnership board members.

For the 2016 STAs<sup>1</sup>, SPT has been shortlisted for six projects (further information is attached at Appendix 1), and it is therefore recommended that the Partnership host a table together with attendance from three board members. .

##### 4. Conclusions

The STAs are the pre-eminent annual awards event in the Scottish transport scene's calendar and provide an opportunity to publicise the work of SPT, to network with colleagues from across Scotland and beyond, and to recognise the hard work of SPT and partner organisations staff in project delivery. An update on the outcome of the STAs 2016 will be provided to members in due course.
